



- III. Remember to keep holy the LORD'S Day
- IV. Honor your father and your mother.
- V. You shall not kill.
- VI. You shall not commit adultery.
- VII. You shall not steal.
- VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- IX. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- X. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.



GLOBAL JEWISH POPULATION AND SPREAD

- Judaism is the <u>smallest of</u> the 3 religions.
- Judaism spread through emigration/captivity/expuls ion
- After the <u>Holocaust</u>, most <u>Jews relocated to Israel</u> and the <u>United States</u>
- The massive influx (1930-1940's) to what is today Israel <u>caused extreme</u> <u>tension in Palestine</u>



GLOBAL SPREAD OF CHRISTIANITY

Initially expanded throughout the <u>Mediterranean region</u> and into <u>Europe</u>.

 Brought to the New World during exploration and conquest


 Significant modern growth in Sub-Saharan Africa / Asia Pacific regions and around the world.




GLOBAL SPREAD OF ISLAM

- Islam was a <u>unifying</u> force in the <u>Arabian Peninsula</u>.
- Spread east, often by trade
 (Indonesia, Malaysia). West, mainly through conquest.
- Spain, Hungary, southeast Europe were all under Islamic rule for centuries
- Current strongholds: Philippines,
 Nigeria, Kenya

Islam around the world




JERUSALEM HOLDS SOME OF THE HOLIEST SITES FOR JEWS, CHRISTIANS

AND MUSLIMS. Holy sites in Jerusalem's Old City

- Jews call the 35-acre compound Temple
 Mount because it was the site of their Second
 Temple, which was destroyed by the Romans.
 Muslims call it the Noble Sanctuary and see it
 as the third most Holy site in Islam. The site is
 controlled by Muslims but some Jews and
 Israelis want the right to pray there.
- Dome of the Rock Islamic tradition says that the Prophet Mohammad ascended to heaven on a winged horse from this spot.
- Al-Aqsa Mosque The third holiest in Islam after Mecca and Medina in Saudi Arabia.
- Western Wall The last remnant of the Second Temple compound and one of the holiest sites in Judaism.
- Church of the Holy Sepulcher Christians believe the church marks the sites where Jesus Christ was crucified and buried.

WESTERN WALL/ WAILING WAL

- 1. It is the only remains of the **Second Temple of Jerusalem** and is uniquely holy to Jews.
- 2. It was destroyed by the Romans in 70 ce.
- 3. Also known as the Wailing Wall, it is a major site of pilgrimage for Jews around the world with over 1 million pilgrims visiting each year.





CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE

Christian Holy Site

- 1. The site is said to be where **Jesus** was crucified and killed.
- 2. It is also believed by Christians to be the site of the Jesus' **tomb** and **the resurrection into Heaven.**
- 3. Located in the **Christian Quarter** of Jerusalem
- 4. It was **partially destroyed** in 1099 by the Fatimid Caliphate.
- 5. Throughout history, a **Jordanian Muslim** family keeps the keys and premises safe






DOME OF THE ROCK / AL AQSA MOSQUE/ NOBLE SANCTUARY

Islamic Holy Sites

The site is where **Mohammad** is traditionally believed to have **ascended into Heaven**.



The grounds are built on what Jews call the Temple Mount. They include **The Dome of the Rock**, gardens, the **Al Aqsa Mosque** and the **Noble Sanctuary**.

This is currently a **flashpoint** between Jewish and Muslim worshippers and source of tension
